

¹ Voter turnout of 7% of all eligible voters compares to fall election turnout of 11% in 2016, 10% in 2015, 16.1% in 2014, 18.2% in 2013, 22.1% in 2012, 14.6% in 2011, 17.8% in 2010, 10.9% in 2009, and 8.9% in Fall 2008. The Fall 2010 election marked the first time that RHA, and the Hall and Apartments Councils conducted their elections using the same online ballot as MUSG, likely resulting in greater voter turnout starting that year.
